6-PIN DIP, HIGH ISOLATION VOLTAGE 1-ch Optical Coupled MOS FET

DESCRIPTION

The PS7342-1A and PS7342L-1A are solid state relays containing GaAs LEDs on the light emitting side (input side) and MOS FETs on the output side.

They are suitable for analog signal control because of their low offset and high linearity.

The PS7342L-1A has a surface mount type lead.













MAXIMUM LORD CURRENT vs. AMBIENT TEMPERATURE




FORWARD VOLTAGE vs. AMBIENT TEMPERATURE




OUTPUT CAPACITANCE vs. APPLIED VOLTAGE



OFF-STATE LEAKAGE CURRENT vs. APPLIED VOLTAGE




LORD CURRENT vs. LORD VOLTAGE




NORMALIZED ON-STATE RESISTANCE vs. AMBIENT TEMPERATURE




ON-STATE RESISTANCE DISTRIBUTION




TURN-ON TIME vs. FORWARD CURRENT




TURN-OFF TIME vs. FORWARD CURRENT




TURN-ON TIME DISTRIBUTION



TURN-OFF TIME DISTRIBUTION




NORMALIZED TURN-ON TIME vs. AMBIENT TEMPERATURE




